Ours is the Girls College and majority of our college students are from rural and interior areas. The surrounding areas population is educationally, socially and economically backward. The students also work in the field or doing labor work for their livelihood. They don't have healthy educational environment at home. The institution started co-operative training for these young girls for one week. The aim of this training is to inspire and encourage them for their livelihood. We invite expert from Co-operative Union. The training is conducted every year in the institute with a view to enable the students to understand the functioning of cooperative activities. The weekly training creates a proper environment for cooperative activities. The students can start some cooperative activity in future. In the highly competitive market scenario, such training can help them to serve as well as to earn in rural and urban area.

The present market and commercial context requires something more concrete and fruitful as the option for capitalism and mixed economic policies. The cooperative sector can serve as a better substitute for growth and development of economic policy. Around 60% mass of the society is benefited by the cooperative activity directly or indirectly.
